## Wermlands Nation's Environmental Policy

Wermlands nation shall actively work to reduce its negative impact on the environment. The only possible limit regarding the environmental work is economic factors.

General objectives: The main objectives with the environmental work are to reduce the nation's waste and energy use and simultaneously increase members' environmental consciousness. By working along these guidelines, we will meet the requirements for the environmental certifications KRAV and the Nation Frog.

Wermlands Nation sees that it is important that the nation commits to its environmental responsibilities regarding energy supply, the purchase of food, beverage and detergents. By following KRAV regulations for restaurants and caterers, we reduce the nation's environmental impact while helping to promote organic farming. The nation has to make sure that the certification is renewed every year.

Division of responsibility: Seniorskollegiet (the board) is responsible for the adoption of environmental policy and the Kuratel (management) is responsible for approving the environmental plan. It is the environmental coordinator's responsibility to continually update the environmental plan. The Kurator is responsible for making sure that all foremen are aware of and educated on the policy and plan and that the policy is available to all members. The foremen are responsible for informing their workers about the environmental routines which they must follow.

Environmental coordinators meet with the Kuratel regularly to track the fulfillment of the environmental plan. For the final Landskap (nation meeting) of the semester, there should be a report written by the Environmental Coordinators to show which objectives have been achieved and what projects will be focused on for the next semester.
